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1.0 Whistle Blower

1.1 Purpose

The purpose of this Whistleblower Policy is to encourage employees and contractors to report any violations or suspected violations of the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act ("OHSA") without fear of retaliation or reprisal.

1.2 Scope

This policy applies to all employees and contractors of The Electrical Works Ltd.

1.3 Reporting

Employees and contractors are encouraged to report any violations or suspected violations of the OHSA to their immediate supervisor or to the designated OHSA Compliance Officer. Reports may also be made anonymously, either in writing or by telephone, to the Compliance Officer.

1.4 Investigation

All reports of violations or suspected violations of the OHSA will be investigated promptly and thoroughly by the Compliance Officer or an appointed investigator. All investigations will be conducted in a confidential manner to the extent possible.

1.5 Protection

Retaliation or reprisal of any kind against an employee or contractor who makes a report under this policy is strictly prohibited. Any employee or contractor who engages in retaliation or reprisal will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment or contract.





1.6 Confidentiality

All reports and investigations will be treated with strict confidentiality, and the identity of the reporting employee or contractor will not be disclosed unless required by law or authorized by the reporting employee or contractor.

1.7 Records

All reports and investigations will be documented and retained in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

1.8 Conclusion

At The Electrical Works Ltd., we are committed to providing a safe and healthy workplace for all employees and contractors. We believe that all employees and contractors have a responsibility to report any violations or suspected violations of the OHSA, and we are committed to protecting those who make such reports. This Whistleblower Policy is just one part of our ongoing commitment to promoting a culture of safety and compliance.

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
